The Hills Amenity Society celebrates its 30th birthday this year! The society was formed in March 1972 for the public benefit of the area bounded by Goldings Hill, Church Hill, Kings Green, southern end of York Hill, including York Crescent, numbers 81 – 105 Staples Road and the Epping Forest boundary from Staples Road to Goldings Hill. This area has, of course, been extended but still operates to pursue the interests of the inhabitants of the Conservation Areas.

Conservation is NOT about opposing anything new or different in the area. It is NOT about opposing every tree lopping, pruning, trimming or even felling. It is about maintaining the integrity of the Conservation Area. To ensure that any development, whether new buildings or modifications and extensions to existing buildings, is in keeping with the character of the area, is in scale with its site and is an enhancement of the general amenity and ambience of its surroundings. The Hills Amenity Society knows that for progress to take place development and conservation must work together. As far as the trees and hedges are concerned, they are, obviously, an integral part of the Conservation Area and therefore need protecting. They do also, of course, need care and attention and advice on this is readily available from Chris Nielen's department at EFDC. Any and all work on trees in the Conservation Area has to have the approval of the EFDC.

However, Paddy Hagerty's life long passion has been horticulture and as a well respected member of the RHS he has been called upon to judge many competitions. Although his special interest is fuchsias his interest and knowledge is very wide and includes trees as well as flowers and he will be happy to answer questions. Loughton 100 years ago

Two years ago, HAS and Loughton District Historical Society member, Richard Morris found in the possession of the Waller family a manuscript, written by William Chapman Waller 95 years ago, which described the Loughton he knew. The account, which was written over several years, is gossipy and discursive. It describes the buildings and their inhabitants in a series of amusing pen-portraits which give a real sense of what Loughton was like when the High Road was a quiet backwater along which the seven motor cars in the town occasionally drove. Not all the town is described but most of the Hills area is well covered, with the exception of Staples Road which, with Forest Road, Smarts Lane and the Parks, he did not reach.

Richard Morris and Chris Pond typeset the text and the LDHS has issued it, with high quality and hitherto unpublished photographs of a similar period. It is available from the Loughton Bookshop at 150 High Road priced £5.50. Chris has also reissued his Walk Round Loughton (first published 1995) in a new edition priced £1.25.

Planning matters outside the Hills of general interest

Car park between Lawlors and Eastern Eye restaurant (Lambs Garage site)

Possibly to be developed as a Marks & Spencer Food Hall. HAS has written re potential loss of car parking space.

Higgins High Street development - revised planning application submitted. HAS written re loss of tree and inappropriate design.

Sainsbury's development - everyone should have received information showing proposals. HAS has decided not to comment on this proposed development as opinion in the area appears to be split with as many in favour as against.

City Sports Car Dealers 107/109 High Road - plans for residential houses approved. 259/309 High Road (from Alfrenes to TSB) - proposed conversion to two large retail outlets with refurbishment to upper floors. HAS feels it is unfortunate to lose small, well patronised local shops. Postal sorting office - it appears that the Loughton sorting office move has been delayed - until date unknown. HAS was told that if it moved a small "shop" might be set up from where customers could collect undelivered parcels.

Bosworths - to dispel any rumours – we are informed Bosworths are definitely not closing but merely moving the kitchen! As long as people keep shopping there they intend to stay open. Let's all support them!
